ITEM NO.1

Minutes of the last Meeting held on 03/07/2018

Minutes of the meeting held on 03-07-2018 were read and confirmed.

ITEM NO.2

Action Plan for Student Development

2.1 Innovation in Teaching Learning

It was decided that Innovations in Teaching-Learning shall be continued with introduction of additional instructional strategies and ICT tools

2.2 Creation of LCM

It was decided that all faculty shall continue with Learner centric MOOC (LCM) activity. It was recommended to create 3 videos on courses taught by each faculty member using the recording studio and its equipment. Faculty members have created 597 videos on 33 courses.

2.3 Lifelong Learning through self learning

Self learning ability of the students shall be nurtured by making them enroll for various courses available on MOOC platform. In the first semester 1383 students have registered for NPTEL and 1247 students in second semester.

2.4 Problem based/Project based learning

It was recommended that

- Students shall be encouraged to use platforms such as Hacker Rank, Hacker Earth
 etc. for improving problem solving skills through programming. 5 projects are
 submitted For Smart India Hackathon for selection of teams.
- To encourageUG and PG students to select Industry and societal relevance projects.

• Training on modern industry technologies should be introduced to students to embed them in their project.

Students are working on 27 industry sponsored projects.

2.5 Employability Enhancement & Skill development

• Training

It is recommended to conduct in house and out sourced training for students to enhance employability ability.

During the first semester of A.Y.2018-2019, various in-house and outsourced training programmes are arranged to make the students placement worthy. These include the modules namely — (i) Quantitative Aptitude, (ii) Logical Reasoning, (iii) Data Interpretation, (iv) Resume Writing, (v) Group Discussion, (vi) Personal Interview, (vii) Grammar, (viii) Vocabulary, (ix) Reading Comprehension, (x) Soft Skills (xi) Verbal Ability- Infosys Pattern (xii) Technical (C Language) (xiii) GATE training sessions. Resource persons from industry, educational institutions and in-house faculty members have trained and guided our students.

Special training sessions on Python by in house faculty & industry experts are arranged. Which will improve quality placements through InfyTQ / HackwithInfy, TCS Ninja / Codevita competitions, where expertise of Python is essential.

• Student Internship

It is decided that efforts shall be taken to have paid internships for students and more focus on conversion of students' internshipinto placement.

Atlas Copco is visiting our institute on 11 March, 2019 for selecting students for internship.

Placement

It is decided that One hour everyday training for employability enhancement of students shall be imparted for all SE, TE, BE students

Till date our 163 students have been placed in 13companies including MNCs Infosys, TCS, Tata Technologies, L&T Infotech, Wipro, Amazone, Persistent.

2.6 Assessment of Learning Outcome & Corrective measures, if any

Assessment on Learning Outcome is done & corrective measures are taken.

ITEM NO. 3

Action Planfor Faculty Development

3.1 Qualification Upgradation

It is recommended that faculty should upgrade their qualification & acquire doctorate degree.

Three faculty has completed their research work &awarded Ph.D. Degree. 24 faculty members are pursuing Ph.D. at various universities.

3.2 Training for Faculty

It is decided that all faculty members shall attend at least one FDP/Workshop/MOOC for upgradation.

Overall 398 course certifications are done by faculty members.

3.3 Research & Development activities

It is suggested that faculty shall generate funds through various govt/ non govtfundingschemesofresearch projects, modernisation of laboratory etc., sponsored projects and consultancy.

It is also recommended that faculty should continue publishing their research work in reputed journals

Till date 49 research papers are published in various National, International Journals & Conferences by faculty members.

The work of funded research projects are going on.

Revenue of Rs. 1680217/- is generated through consultancy in the year 2018-19 till dec. 2018.

3.4 Skill up gradation of Technical Staff

It is decided that Spoken Tutorial shall be subscribed for training Technical Staff

Five course certifications are done by Technical & Library staff.

3.5 ICT training of faculty of non professional institutes

It is decided to organize ICT Training for faculties of nonprofessional institutes on their request.

It is planned to conduct training sessions for faculty members of nonprofessional institutes for "Creating videos & Moodle course" from 11 Feb, 2019.

The Four UG programs Civil Engg., Mechanical Engg., Electronics Engg., Electronics & Telecommunication Engg., are accredited by NBA, New Delhi.

All the four programs applied has been accredited by NBA for 3 years. The accreditation is valid up to 30-06-2021.

The head of respective department have been asked to go through the reports received from NBA and submit an action plan to overcome the weakness. The action plan of Head of Departments in this regard will be kept for discussion in the next meeting.
